#### **Nevada Republican Party** 1 2022 Draft Platform 2 3 4 **Preamble** 5 We the people of the Nevada Republican Party, affirm that this 6 Nation and this State were founded upon the principle that all 7 people are created equal; that the powers of government as 8 outlined in the Constitution and the Bill of Rights exist to 9 protect the people's God given right to be free and to choose 10 their own pursuit of life, liberty, and happiness; without regard 11 to race, gender, religion, country of origin, or sexual 12 orientation. We invite those who agree with the principles 13 stated herein to join with our efforts so that this Republic will 14 continue to be "The last best hope of earth;" and, so that this 15 Republic will return to the principle that we are a "government 16 of the people, by the people, and for the people." 17 18 **Budget, Economy, and Taxation** 19 We support those in public office who actively support and 20 work toward lower taxes and fees, and seek to reduce the size, 21 cost, and scope of government at all levels. We support a 22 continuation of President Trump's efforts to cut taxes and 23 reduce regulation. Government cannot tax the state or the 24 residents into prosperity. 25

27 Residents of the State of Nevada are not under-taxed and state government is not uder-funded.

Our budget crisis is the result of years of overspending and 29 mismanagement. The COVID-19 shutdown, by emergency 30 order, has only exacerbated the budget crisis. 31 32 We support the Nevada constitutional prohibition on personal 33 income tax. 34 35 We oppose the imposition of the Gross Receipts Tax, 36 Commerce Tax, and any other taxes on businesses that will 37 ultimately drive employers away from our state. 38 39 We support the repeal of the Commerce Tax which is ultimately 40 passed on to the consumer. 41 42 We support elimination of Congressional excessive spending, 43 earmark spending, unfunded mandates, the death/estate tax, 44 capital gains tax, alternate minimum tax, and double taxation 45 on corporate dividends and social security. 46 47 We support sales tax exemption on all Internet sales. We 48 support a free and open Internet. 49 50 We support eliminating the complex and confusing IRS code 51 and replacing the current, burdensome federal tax structure 52 with a simplified tax code. 53 54 We support starting with zero-based (all expenditures justified 55 and clearly explained) balanced budgets at all levels of 56 government to be fully disclosed to the public. 57

- All elected and appointed public servants must live by the same 58 laws as the public, including social security, health care, 59 retirement benefits, etc. 60 61 Citizens should have the right to self-direct all or a portion of 62 their Social Security account. Social Security funds should never 63 be directed outside of the program. 64 65 We support the repeal of taxes that were meant to "sunset," 66 and oppose the practice of creating any new sunset taxes 67 without a vote of the people. 68 69 In the event a tax generates more revenue than is needed for 70 the purpose, the tax should be reduced accordingly. 71 72 We support a free market economy. The government shall not 73 pick winners and losers using taxpayer dollars, tax subsidies, 74 loan guaranties, bailouts, and other public-private partnerships. 75
- We support elimination of minimum wage laws and allow thefree market to determine wage levels.
- 80 We support the elimination of Davis-Bacon law.

### Constitution

We support the Constitution of the United States in its original intent and context. We expect our elected officials, appointed officials, and the courts at all levels to support, interpret, and give effect to the Constitution, as prescribed in Article VI.

87 Without further clarification of the rules and process, we do not 88 support an Article V convention. 89 90 We demand that our representatives at all levels of 91 government uphold their Oath of Office. 92 93 We affirm the First Amendment in its totality: religion, speech, 94 press, assembly, and petition the government for redress of 95 grievances. We believe the First Amendment to the 96 Constitution of the United States was intended to prevent a 97 state sponsored religion, rather than a separation of God from 98 government. Attempts to force individuals or religious 99 institutions to violate their conscience are contrary to the 100 Constitution. 101 102 The Second Amendment is the recognition of our God-given 103 right to keep and bear arms recognized under both the U.S. and 104 Nevada Constitutions. No government entity shall infringe upon 105 that right. We vow to preserve and defend that right against 106 any infringements by statute, initiative, regulation, executive 107 order, international treaty, gun registration, permit 108 requirement, age requirement or Red Flag laws. 109 110 Specifically, we support the repeal of AB291 (Red Flag law) 111 adopted in 2019, which allows confiscation of firearms without

due process.

We support constitutional carry and concealed carry reciprocity 115 among all fifty states. 116 117 We oppose "gun-free zones". 118 119 We support the Fourth Amendment to the Constitution of the 120 United States that protects the right of the people to be secure 121 in their persons, houses, papers, and effects against 122 unreasonable searches, seizures, liens, and forfeitures, 123 including civil asset forfeitures, without due process. 124 125 We call upon Congress to review and remove from the Patriot 126 Act and the National Defense Authorization Act any part that 127 violates the Constitution and Bill of Rights. We call on 128 Congress to review FISA Court procedures and identify and 129 provide cures for any abuses that have or are occurring. We 130 support harsh penalties for any abuse. 131 132 All Government branches shall respect the rights of the States 133 in accordance with the Tenth Amendment. The Nevada 134 Attorney General shall defend the rights of the State of Nevada 135 and the people as defined by the Ninth and Tenth 136 Amendments. 137 138 We support Constitutional justification for all Federal and State 139 legislation. Federal and State Legislatures should address the 140 constitutionality of executive orders and agency regulations, 141 within sixty days of enactment. 142

We support changing NRS to limit the Governor's state-wide 144 emergency powers to 14 days, unless extended by a 2/3 vote of 145 the Legislature. 146 147 Federal and State legislation should be limited to a single issue 148 referencing the applicable Constitutional authority and allow a 149 24-hour minimum public review period for every twenty 150 pages of text after a bill is presented to the floor. 151 152 Education 153 The federally mandated educational system is failing our 154 children and not preparing them to succeed in today's global 155 economy. We support the elimination of the US Department of 156 Education. 157 158 Our public education system needs substantial improvement. 159 We support local control of public education with the money 160 following the child, giving parents and guardians more options 161 in school choice. 162 163 Parents/guardians should be able to choose between public, 164 charter, private schools, or homeschooling as the best option 165 for their children. 166 167 We support implementing and funding Education Savings 168 Accounts (ESA), Opportunity Scholarships, and other funding 169

options.

We support the repeal and defunding of mandated curricula 172 such as Common Core, as well as the testing, data collection, 173 data mining, psychological profiling and tracking that follow 174 students for life. 175 176 We oppose using school time for critical race theory, radical sex 177 education, gender identity issues, social engineering, social 178 emotional learning, etc. 179 180 We support protecting the safety and privacy of children by 181 keeping bathrooms and locker rooms single sex associated with 182 the child's biological sex. We support keeping single sex sports 183 based on biological sex. 184 185 We support student loan privatization. 186 187 We support Career and Technical Education (CTE), vocational, 188 and technical training. 189 190 We oppose the deference to, mock practice of, or explicit 191 advocacy of a specific religion by public schools. The study of 192 religion in public school is appropriate only in the context of a 193 course on comparative religion and their similarities and 194 differences are discussed fairly and accurately. 195 196 We oppose mandated sex and gender education curriculum for 197 all students being taught in our public schools PK-12. We 198 support parental/guardian's rights to opt in or out of the class. 199

We support maintaining an elected, rather than appointed, Board of 201 Regents as specified by the Nevada Constitution. 202 203 We support the efficient use of funds within the Nevada System of 204 Higher Education (NSHE). 205 206 We support programs such as dual-enrollment programs which help 207 high school students receive college credit before high school 208 graduation and stay within the Nevada System of Higher Education 209 (NSHE). 210 211 We support state and federal funding which support our high-research 212 R1 Institutions which focus on creating a workforce capable of meeting 213 the needs of the economy within the State of Nevada. 214 215 **Elections** 216 We advocate proof of U.S. citizenship and residency at the time 217 of voter registration and requiring government issued photo ID 218 at the time of voting. 219 220 We oppose same day voter registration to preserve election 221 integrity. 222 223 We call for rescinding election laws passed by the 2021 Nevada 224 Legislature that degrade election integrity. 225 226 We support all electronic voting systems having a voter verified 227 paper audit trail that is to be used in the event of a recount or 228 an electronic malfunction. 229 230

We urge the Nevada Legislature to reinstate the Presidential 231 Caucus system to remain "First in the West" during the 232 Presidential Campaign. 233 234 We oppose automatic voter registration through the 235 Department of Motor Vehicles. 236 237 We support the current, partisan primary election system, and 238 oppose any alternative such as the Open Primary System. 239 240 The Electoral College must be maintained to ensure 241 representation of the less populated states. 242 243 We urge the Secretary of State and the Attorney General to 244 investigate allegations and enforce penalties for election fraud 245 of any kind. 246 247 We oppose Federal efforts to usurp voting rights and 248 procedures that are Constitutionally allocated to the States. 249 250 **Energy** 251 252 Any level of dependence on foreign oil threatens our national 253 security and our economy. We must continue to aggressively 254 develop and pursue domestic energy resources including, but 255 not limited to, petroleum, natural gas, coal, nuclear, and 256 alternative sources. 257

- We believe the free market should determine the development 259 of all energy resources, free from government planning, 260 interference, regulation, subsidy or mandate. 261 262 We support positioning Yucca Mountain as a world class, high-263 tech nuclear research, reprocessing, repurposing, recycling and 264 science facility predicated upon sound, safe and proven 265 scientific principles. Nevada should negotiate an agreement so 266 that Nevadans enjoy the financial and economic benefits of 267 hosting the nation's nuclear assets. 268
- We support the elimination of the Federal EnvironmentalProtection Agency.

301	affect the health and fertility of minor children.

304	We welcome people from all nations, races, and cultures who
305	enter our country legally and support the Constitution of the
306	United States of America and our rule of law. We support
307	annual, merit-based immigration and naturalization levels that
308	maintain sustainable employment and wage growth for all
309	Americans.

311	We support strict enforcement of immigration laws by all levels
312	of government and law enforcement.

317	We support the Four Pillars of Immigration reform in sequence:
318	1. Secure the border (build the border wall, increase
319	Department of Homeland Security agents, and
320	continuation of Title 42)
321	2. Ending visa lottery (Diversity Immigrant Visa Program)
322	3. Ending chain migration
323	4. Path to citizenship for DREAMers

325	We do not support blanket amnesty, government benefits, or
326	other special treatment for those who enter the United States
327	illegally.
328	
329	We oppose sanctuary cities, counties, and states. We oppose
330	automatic citizenship for children born in the United States to
331	foreign visitors or to those who are here temporarily or illegally
332	We believe the original intent of the Fourteenth Amendment
333	(adopted in 1868) did not confer citizenship on children born to
334	non-citizens.
335	Limited Covernment
336	Limited Government The powers of government should be limited to those
337	enumerated in the U.S. and state constitutions. We support
338 339	limited government, lower taxes, less regulation, and more
340	individual responsibility.
341	marvidual responsibility.
342	We support independent auditing with full disclosure and
343	transparency of the Federal Reserve, Fannie Mae, Freddy Mac
344	and all other federally sponsored corporations.
345	

346	We support holding Congress accountable for the minting and
347	printing of U.S. currency by repealing the Federal Reserve Act.
348	
349	We support removing local, state, and federal governments
350	from the marriage covenant.
351	
352	We support in-person voting by members of Congress, and do
353	not support the use of proxies.
354	
355	We oppose the proposed State Equal Rights Amendment (SJR8)
356	that will be on the 2022 general ballot.

358	Military / National Defense
359	We support fully funding and supporting our military as
360 361	necessary to meet the demands of modern warfare.
362	The United States should avoid entanglements with foreign
363	nations and attempt to maintain neutralities in foreign
364	conflicts. We support peace through strength to sustain our
365	national defense and protect our citizens abroad.
366	
367	We continue to support a strong Veterans Administration
368	subject to effective oversight and audit to ensure veterans and
369	their families receive the care, benefits and support earned as
370	promised.
371	
372	We support an aggressive program to protect the electrical grid
373	and other infrastructure against EMP (electromagnetic pulse)
374	and cyber-attacks.

375 We reject policies that undermine law enforcement's ability to 376 protect persons and property. 377 378 **Nevada Natural Resource Use and Management** 379 We support the federal government relinquishing to the State 380 of Nevada her federally managed lands, excluding 381 constitutionally authorized uses. 382 383 Domestic necessity should always remain the highest priority of 384 water usage over "for profit" uses. We oppose restrictions on 385 domestic wells such as mandatory connection to utilities and 386 reduction to 2-acre foot allotment or less per year that 387 endanger a rural lifestyle. We oppose the metering of domestic 388 wells and taxing the usage. 389 390 We support the 1872 mining law including the recognition of 391 easements and rights-of-way that allow access to and through 392 public lands. 393 394 We support the mining industry. We strongly oppose any laws, 395 regulations, ordinances, or other legally binding actions that 396 diminish the ability of the mining industry to discover and/or 397 access minerals and mine them. We support the streamlining 398 the permitting and application processes. 399 400 We support the livestock and agricultural industries in Nevada 401 including the individual ownership of grazing rights, water 402 rights, and access to grazing lands. 403

404 We oppose any laws, regulations, ordinances or other legally 405 binding actions that diminish the ability of ranches, farms and 406 their livestock to make productive use of lands or forages under 407 the control of each ranch and farm. 408 409 Controlled or prescribed fire and grazing should be used in 410 concert with proper grazing management and other vegetation 411 management tools to provide for sustainable rangelands and 412 rangeland enterprises (e.g. livestock production, wildlife, 413 recreation, etc.). 414 415 We support removing limitations imposed by the Federal 416 government in the development of natural resources. 417 418 We oppose the designation of additional wilderness areas, 419 national monuments, wildlife refuges or wilderness study areas 420 in Nevada without a vote of the people in the affected counties. 421 422 We support removal of the sage hen (grouse) from 423 consideration for inclusion on the endangered species list. 424 425 **Recognition of Israel** 426 We support Israel as a sovereign state and a valuable, 427 democratic ally and recognize her right to exist and defend 428 herself. 429 430 431 432

### **Sanctity of Life** 433 We affirm the sanctity of innocent life and the inherent dignity 434 of each human being from conception to natural death. 435 436 The unborn child has a fundamental right to life and should be 437 welcomed into life and protected under the law. 438 439 We oppose government funding of abortion and organizations 440 that advocate for or provide abortions. 441 442 We oppose assisted suicide, euthanasia and the non-443 consensual withholding of medical treatment resulting in 444 serious injury or death. 445 446 Sovereignty 447 We support limits on the authority of the Federal Government 448 as determined by the United States Constitution. 449 450 We support striking Article 1, Section 2, from the Nevada State 451 Constitution that grants the Federal Government authority to 452 employ armed force against the people of the State of Nevada. 453 454 We affirm our national sovereignty and reject the concept of 455 global governance. No treaty shall supersede the United States 456 Constitution, nor shall international foreign law be relied on or 457 cited. 458 459 No international or foreign law shall be imposed on any 460 individuals within any American jurisdiction. 461

462 We oppose implementation of the United Nations' Agenda 21 463 and Agenda 2030, which lead directly to central control over 464 private property, energy, water use, food production, 465 ownership and use of automobiles, population control, heat 466 and air conditioning in our homes and many other issues. 467 468 We support foreign aid only to those countries that support the 469 United States, and it should have a clear, defined purpose and 470 transparent audit trail. 471 472 We support the defunding of the United Nations (UN) and the 473 removal of UN offices from the United States. 474
