A caucus has none of those issues because it is limited to registered Republicans, who cast their vote by precinct, show ID, vote on paper ballots, and can watch results being tabulated in the open. I will NEVER give up the fight for free and fair elections.

The Democrats in the Legislature chose to block these common sense reforms proposed by Governor Lombardo this past session. While we are laser focused on recruiting for 2024 to take back the Assembly to give Governor Lombardo more support, we also can ensure clean, fair, transparent elections for President, as that is entirely the purview of the Nevada Republican Central Committee – not the corrupt election departments in our most populous counties. It takes all of us – unified – to ensure that we enact election reform everywhere we can. Clean elections start with us.
